Subject: Cardiff Rugby - Joint email from Cardiff Athletic Club and CF10 Rugby Trust

Dear Dave,

We are writing to you further to last week's WRU press conference and in the light of the increasing public speculation about the WRU preferred bidder for Cardiff Rugby.

As you are aware, Cardiff Athletic Club (CAC) and CF10 are major stakeholders in rugby at Cardiff Arms Park and represent a significant number of those who watch the professional and semi-professional game at our ground. As the owner of the Arms Park, CAC is also the guardian of our rugby heritage and will ultimately determine the outcome of any lease applications beyond the current arrangements which terminate in 2028.

We are increasingly concerned that the WRU may base its decision on selling Cardiff to a bidder that best reflects the Union's interest (in terms of being able to swiftly reduce to three professional sides) rather than the best interests of Cardiff rugby.

Any new owner will require the support of the stakeholder groups that we represent to make their investment in Cardiff work. Can you therefore tell us what arrangements you will be putting in place for stakeholder consultation ahead of any decision being made?
